Morris Twp, NJ July 29, 2007: Ron Goldberg has made the following statement in response to the announcement of the 2007 Republican candidate for Morris Township Committee.

"Last year's election was about initiating change and beginning movement toward balanced government. This year's election is about continuing to change from the way things have been run for the last 33 years. We still need to move closer to balance in our government. One more of the five Committee seats needs to be separated from the voting block to ensure that a good proposal gets a second, that a good idea is not silenced, that a good question is not ignored or ridiculed.

I have been a citizen of our township for 26 years. I love our town. It is a good place to live, but we could be doing better by our citizens.

For the past 3 years, I have walked the streets and knocked on the doors of Morris Township to talk to our citizens. Over and over again they have told me that they want change. They have told me they want to be heard. They have told me that balance is necessary for the health of government and, that balance leads to the exchange of ideas, openness and accountability they insist on.

And I have a picture of how our citizens want to interact with their government. They want it to be easy to give timely input -- AND they want to be listened to when they do. They want government to be open to them, and they don't want to be intimidated or out maneuvered by a government board, commission, or committee.

This election will be about true change: a real change from the way things have been run the last 33 years. For this change to occur, we must complete the job of restoring balance to our government, making it transparent, opening it to all the citizens, and planning forward. In this way, our town will be the kind of place we will want to live in for a very long time. I look forward to a vigorous campaign."
